SDG 6: Water and Sanitation

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all:

- By 2030, achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all
- By 2030, achieve access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations

SDG 17: Partnerships

A successful sustainable development agenda requires partnerships between governments, the private sector and civil society. These inclusive partnerships built upon principles and values, a shared vision, and shared goals that place people and the planet at the centre, are needed at the global, regional, national and local level.

- Encourage and promote effective public, public-private and civil society partnerships, building on the experience and resourcing strategies of partnerships

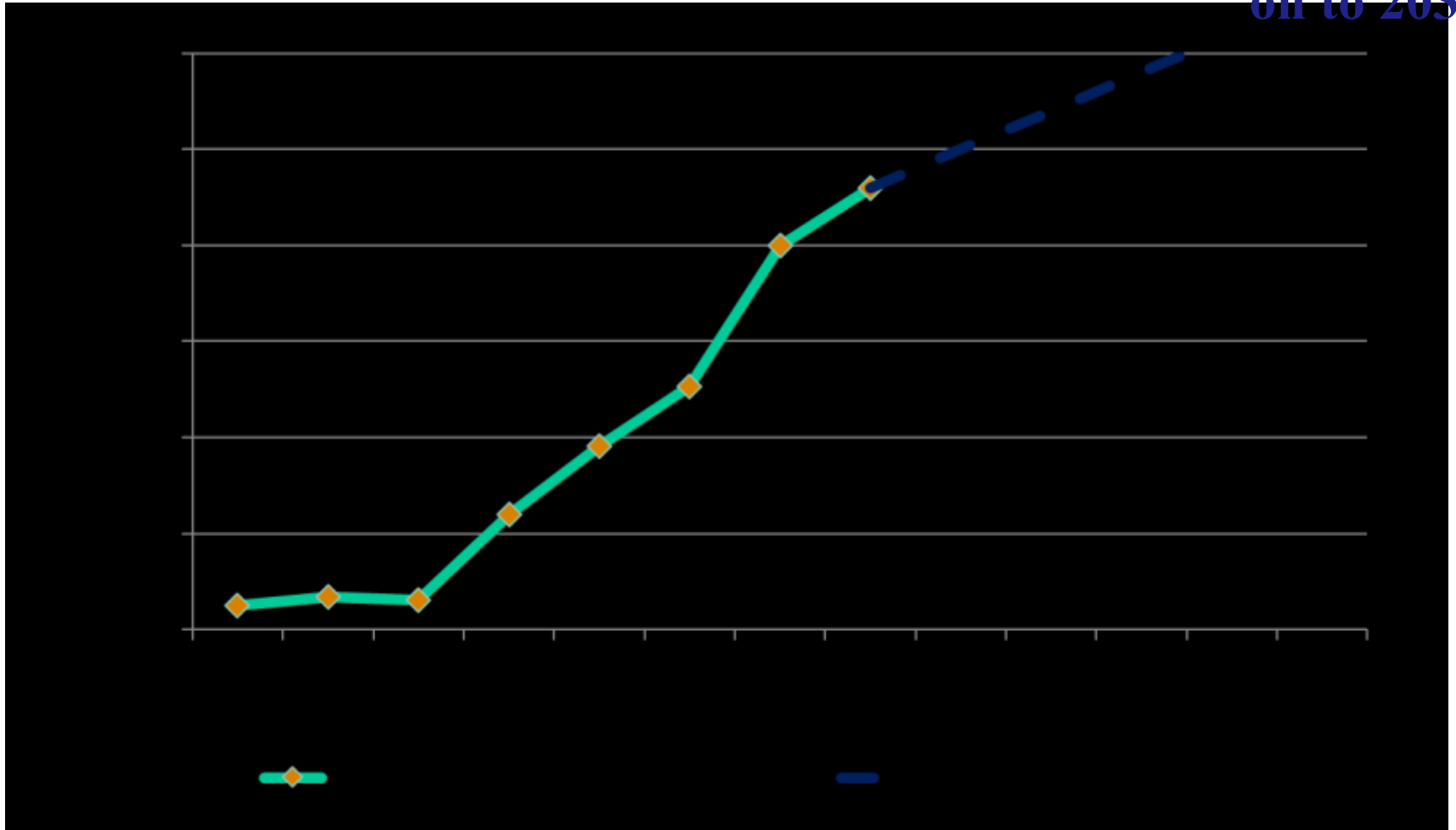
World Vision is Committed to Help Solve the Global Water & Sanitation Crisis

- Reach 1 new person with clean water every 30 seconds
- Commitment to reach one new person every 10 seconds by 2020.
- Reach 4 new schools every day with clean water, improved sanitation and hygiene
- 5 new communities every day are certified as open defecation free in World Vision program areas
- We believe we can reach everyone everywhere we work by 2030 with clean water and sanitation.

Partnerships with Private Sector

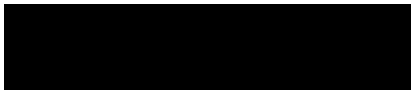
- Build access to new markets
