





Educational Infrastructure in Jordan in Light of the Syrian Refugee Crisis

- Since the beginning of the Syria Crisis in 2011, more than 650.000
 Syrian refugees have been officially registered in Jordan.
- 85% live in host communities.
- 56% of the schools in Jordan are public schools (3,694).
- Jordanian MoED has introduced double shifts in 198 public schools (DSS).
- Increased number of students placed greater strain on educational infrastructure, particularly sanitation and hygiene facilities at schools.
