

Investments and Budget Allocation

- Inadequate public budgets in most countries
- Incomplete economic analysis based on perceived high costs of developing wastewater collection networks and treatment facilities and low returns without sound economic assessment and feasibility



Major Challenge: Implementation



- Large diversity at the national level ministries and local level institutions for wastewater management
- Limited inter-ministerial and inter-institutional collaboration with largely unclear and overlapping responsibilities
