#### 1. REGIONAL LEVEL

## Identify and align with existing mechanisms and Processes:

Regional sub-regional, national, local level for human rights monitoring and SDG monitoring processes

- ☐ Baselines/Mapping what exists, regional policies, mandates, reporting mechanisms and processes
- ☐ Harmonize regional/Member States reporting processes for coherence

e.g. Africa Agenda, Africa Vision

AUC + AMCOW = WASSMO intercontinental monitoring and reporting mechanism

#### 2. NATIONAL LEVEL

Development and/or adjustments to Human Rights National Plans of Action

- ☐ Country mapping what is the status of implementation and monitoring of HRWS?
- Human Rights sensitive Indicators (structural, process and Outcome)
- ☐ Legislative measures targeted policy actions
- □ HRWS Norms and principles in national minimum standards
- Enhancing Regulatory frameworks respecting HR norms and principles
- What are the data sources for the Human rights indicators and how can we ensure the progressive realization?



#### 3. PROGRAMMATIC LEVEL

Monitoring HRWS progressive realization through development practice

- ☐ Align financing of water and sanitation programmes with HRWS:
  - ☐ Review policies and strategies.
  - ☐ Articulate HR-sensitive indicators
  - □ Align planning and targeting; monitoring and reporting; data disaggregation with HRWS norms/principles
- ☐ Contractual arrangements reinforcing respect for HRWS: social, economic and environmental impacts esp. with private sector partnerships
