

### SSI - Sustainable Services Initiative

Supported by Viva con Agua in Uganda, Ethiopia, Malawi and Nepal



Between 2000 and 2010, approximately 800 million people were provided "first-time access" to water

Of 126,251 water points in 37 countries being monitored by AKVO Flow - 20% are non-functional and 10% are functional but have problems

National data is usually disaggregated into only two categories - "No access" and "access to improved source"

### The alternative facts

Give us Euro 25 and we will provide a family with safe drinking water - Forever!

If the water installation breaks down, it's usually because of the corruption within committees, local government and poor national policies.

We are transparent and accountable.

### The Vicious Cycle

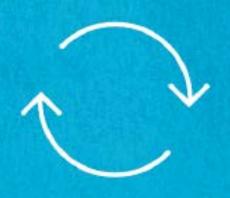
## We build, handover and move on

Our default WASH program design

- Build new or rehabilitate water infrastructure
  - · Build new or rehabilitate toilets
  - Training for hygiene and management

We don't know where we have built it and if it's still working

- no inventory
- Occasional monitoring during implementation
- No post implementation monitoring



# The questionable cause of failure fallacy

Pump breakdowns are frequently associated with

- · Poor national policies
  - Corruption
- Inadequate community management

The effect of this is that our WASH projects

- Ignore or don't support national policy
- Are suspicious of govt. motives/actions
- Repeat our default WASH program design

### SSI - A Systems Approach



Shift from thinking about WASH only in terms of hardware to WASH services



Work to strengthen local government and country systems



Commit to the long-term in meaningful units of scale (e.g. district) to provide universal coverage



Promote shared monitoring and feedback to improve performance and accountability - not being afraid ourselves
