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Research Aim



To investigate and address the barriers to MHM adolescents and young people with disabilities and their carers face in Nepal.











Methodology



Systematic review

To investigate the MH requirements of disabled people and their carers, and the barriers they experience

Formative research

To understand the specific barriers faced by the target group in Kavre district

Pilot intervention

Currently designing intervention and feasibility study will be led to understand if it is acceptable/feasible for wider scale testing







Key Findings



"We don't know anything else. I don't go anywhere. I hear that people come to our village to teach about those things, but I haven't been taught about the menstruation management"

- Carer of a person with an intellectual impairment.




