#### Serious global water challenges

- 80% of global populations exposed to high levels of threat to human water security
- Water quality severely affected in more than 80% of the world's transboundary river systems
- 20% of the world's aquifers are being overexploited, some massively so


All aggravated by climate change




## Why is the source-to-sea approach needed?

- Virtually no marine area is unaffected by anthropogenic activities
  (80% of all pollution from land-based sources)
- Dead zones in coastal areas have spread exponentially since 1960s
- Plastics production increased twenty-fold over the last 50 years

Source-to-sea key flows


"The objective with the source-to-sea approach is to identify appropriate courses of action in a given source-to-sea system that address alterations in key source-to-sea flows and lead to economic, social and environmental benefits."

A added specific objective is to link the implementation of the SDG's on freshwater (SDG 6) and Oceans (SDG 14)

- as discussed and agreed at the High-Level Political Forums in 2017 (SDG 14 Review and UN Oceans Conference) and 2018 (SDG 6 Review)

- Take a holistic view from "source" to "sea" by understanding the linkages between land, freshwater and marine environments.
- Engage with upstream and downstream stakeholders and the public sector to implement source-to-sea smart policies and practices.
- Innovate new solutions that accrue upstream-downstream source-to-sea benefits.
