California (US)

State level legal framework (AB2480)- 2016 "established policy of the state that source watersheds are recognized and defined as integral components of California's water infrastructure."



Peru

National & municipal regulation support the inclusion of ecosystem services in water management and delivery across Peru.



South Africa


Constitutional framework, via National Water Act (1998) recognizes catchments as part of water management.



European Union

Systems approach to water management adopted in 2000. Subsequent national policies designed to support catchment plans.
