Targets SDG GOAL 6:

6.1 By 2030, achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all 6.2 By 2030, achieve access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations 6.3 By 2030, improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping and minimizing release of hazardous chemicals and materials, halving the proportion of untreated wastewater and substantially increasing recycling and safe reuse globally









Targets SDG GOAL 6 cont.

6.4 By 2030, substantially increase **water-use efficiency** across all sectors and ensure sustainable withdrawals and supply of freshwater to address **water scarcity** and substantially reduce the number of people suffering from water scarcity

6.5 By 2030, implement integrated water resources management at all levels, including through trans-boundary cooperation as appropriate
6.6 By 2020, protect and restore water-related ecosystems, including mountains, forests, wetlands, rivers, aquifers and lakes
6.a By 2030, expand international cooperation and capacity-building support to developing countries in water- and sanitation-related activities and programs, including water harvesting, desalination, water efficiency, wastewater treatment, recycling and reuse technologies
6.b Support and strengthen the participation of local communities in improving water and sanitation management



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considered in measuring these indicators ?

- JMP has recently reported on quintile analysis and is currently reviewing inequalities and developing a better understanding of urban -rural definitions
- GEMI will look closely at wastewater and water quality aspects
- Critical will be the possibility to disaggregate the indicators by gender AND socio-economic status. So we capture both the poor and gender aspects





6.2 and 6.3: how do we ensure gender sensitivity in the indicators ?

- Governments should be encouraged develop national monitoring strategies which include gender disaggregation, to enable better planning and allocation of resources
- There is a need to explore particularly the hygiene part of 6.2 and the other parts of 6.3 related to wastewater management and ambient water quality
- New and novel forms of data collection are now available.
 Community-based monitoring such as smartphone sources & methods can be combined with real-time display of information to ensure transparency and accountability

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Proposed Principles for indicators from Women's Major Group (SDGs – 2030 Agenda)

- Focus on transformative indicators
- Do not limit the scope of the target
- Do not only measure what is already being measured
- Include qualitative and process indicators
- Lift the lid of the 'household'

Proposed Indicators till date:

- Draft indicators by 'UNSTAT are online
- Member states can suggest changes till 4.Sept'15
- Proposed UN indicators Target 6.2.
 - Prop.1: % of Population using safely managed sanitation services
 Prop 2.: % of Population whose faecal waste is safely managed
 - Prop 3: % of Population with handwashing facilities
- Proposed WMG/WECF indicators for Target 6.2:
 - Prop 1:% of Girls attending secondary school (13-15 yrs old) without missing school days during menstruation (MPI)
 - Prop 2: % of Population using safely managed sanitation services defined as safe, separate sanitation facilities, with water and soap, including accommodations for menstrual hygiene management in public, private, rural and urban spaces, including schools

Proposed Indicators thus far from UNSTAT

- Proposed UN indicators Target 6.3.
 - Prop. 3: % of wastewater safely treated, disaggregated by economic activity
 - Prop 4: % of population resilient/robust to pollution/ hazardous chemicals in urban and rural areas (MPI)
 - Prop 5: % of waste water from domestic and industrial uses safely treated (a ladder of improvement will be used)
- Proposed WMG/WECF indicators for Target 6.3:
 - Prop 1: % of population (or women headed-households) safely reusing domestic wastewater
 - Prop 2: % of women and men in decision making positions of wastewater and drinking water utilities/authorities
 - Prop 3: % of water and wastewater infrastructure projects having women equally participating in assessments and decision making
