FRESHWATER AQUACULTURE IN CHINA



- 65% of global freshwater aquaculture output (31 million tonnes in 2015)
- 9.1 million people employed
- 65% of the fish and crustaceans eaten in China (1/3 of animal protein)





FIFTEEN YEARS OF PARTNERHSHIP LAKE HONG



- Large (350km²) lake, economically and ecologically important
- WWF habitat restoration: reconnection, restocking, management, etc.
- Designated as a RAMSAR site in 2008





SUSTAINABLE AQUACULTURE



- Multi-stakeholder collaboration to create BMP standards
- Training programme in partnership with government, reaching >65,000
- Linking producers with retailers directly





HONGXIANXI'S STORY



- The method: a mix of traditional (grass) and artificial feed
- Building on an existing method to base it more strongly on science
- Enabling the cooperative to gain better access to markets





LOOKING AHEAD



- Continue working with government and retailers
- Achieve scale-up: work with provinces and Yangtze administrations
- Influence consumers by focusing on nutrition and food safety
