Humanitarian needs are increasing and aid is by far insufficient.

Humanitarian aid interventions carried out by international organizations are strongly hindered by a series of obstacles to reach the people in need of assistance.

Syrian Civil Society Organizations are among the most capable bodies to provide support to the population but they receive very little support from international organizations.



Principal objectives

- Strengthen the capacities of Syrian civil society organizations to design and implement humanitarian aid and development assistance projects;
- Contribute to the elaboration by Syrian civil society organizations of humanitarian aid and development assistance projects suitable for submission to the Humanitarian Division of SDC or other donors supporting emergency relief and humanitarian aid in Syria;
- Develop a knowledge base of Syrian civil society organizations active in humanitarian aid, development assistance and/or post conflict planning;
- Provide baseline elements for the design and implementation of a medium term humanitarian aid and development assistance program involving Syrian civil society organizations.
