Providing and sustaining water services is challenged by rising demand, water shortages, climate change, sector governance, and utility management. An enabling environment is required for utilities to perform well and raise their creditworthiness. An Action Agenda will be designed for sustainable water service by 2025.

Various stakeholders (operators, financers, ministers, customers) will pitch in 10 minutes their roadmap towards 2025. In this interactive session all participants will actively prioritise their input and draft a concerted Action Agenda towards climate resilient and financial sustainable water services by 2025.
