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

The SAP and the UNILC Draft Articles

- Mainstreaming environmental aspects and prevention of loss and damage (Paris Agreement)
- Sustainable socio-economic basis

Environmental management principles:

- Ecosystem based management approach (UNILC Draft Article 10)
- IWRM (SDG 6.5)

Principles:

- Sustainable Development
- Precautionary (UNILC Draft Article 12)
- Polluter pays
- Anticipatory action
- Accessibility of information (UNILC Draft Article 8&15)
- Public participation and transparency UNILC Draft Article 15)



The Future Implementation of the SAP



Existing agreements on the Nubian Aquifer System is a good foundation, but it not sufficient



Conclusion I



Previous agreements on the Nubian Aquifer System and the Regional Strategic Programme are an example of a good practice in transboundary water cooperation, but more is needed for its implementation



Conclusion II



Implementation of the Regional SAP will benefit from an enhanced understanding of:

- The emerging and evolving rules of international law applicable to transboundary aquifers and
- The good practices stemming from the (few) existing agreements and arrangements.




Conclusion III



Implementation of the Regional SAP should be developed in collaboration with the national implementation of the SDGs and of the Paris Agreement

- Implementation of the Regional SAP will help countries meet SDG 6.5 indicator on transboundary water cooperation
- Implementation of the Regional SAP will also help move towards effective approaches to loss and damage and adaptation climate change related action
