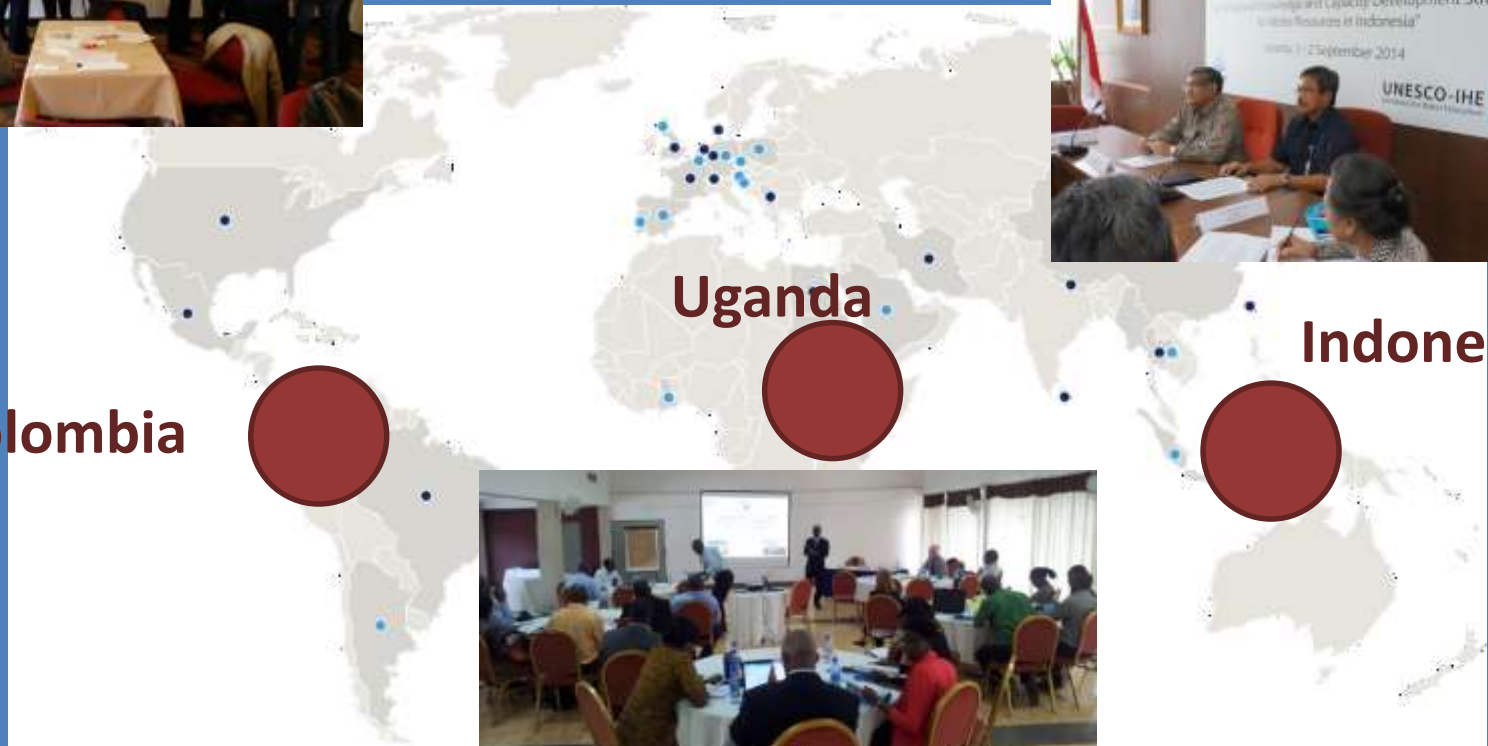
- **Uncoordinated (parallel, overlapping) CD efforts and projects**

National CD Strategies

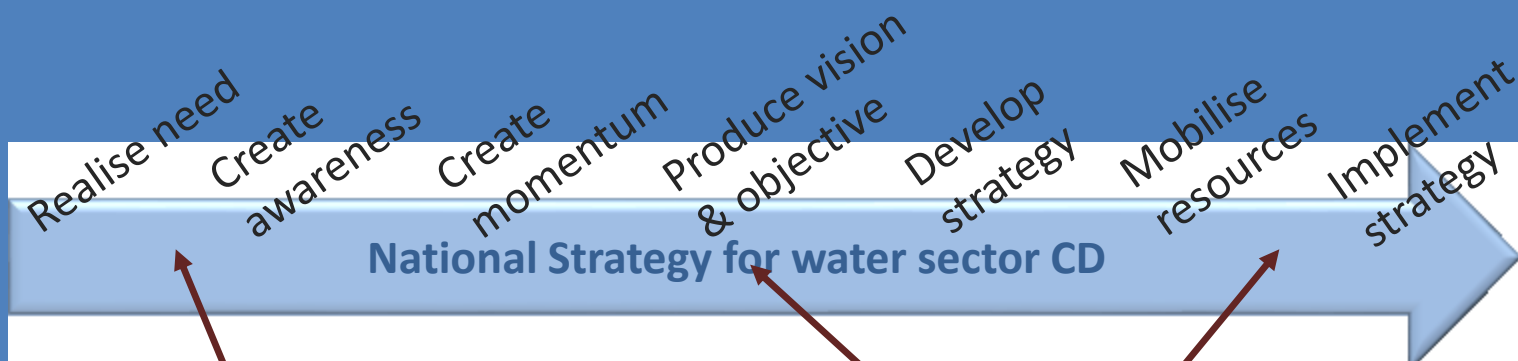
Intended to:

- **Framework** for organising and coordinating CD efforts, incl. external ones
- Set sectoral **CD priorities**
- **Create momentum** for CD & catalyse attention to sector performance and change
- Better **coordination** and **interaction** among sector stakeholders
- Identify relevant **cross-sectoral** issues

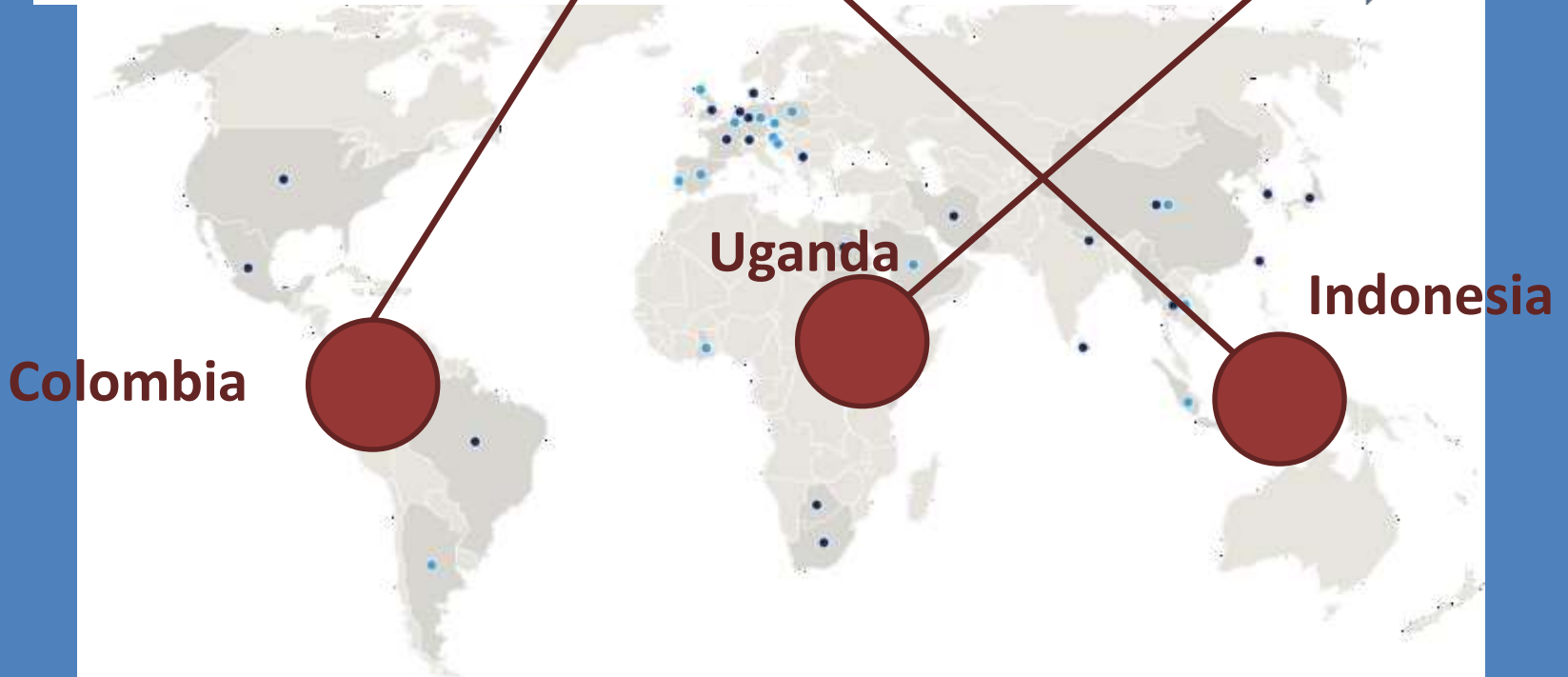
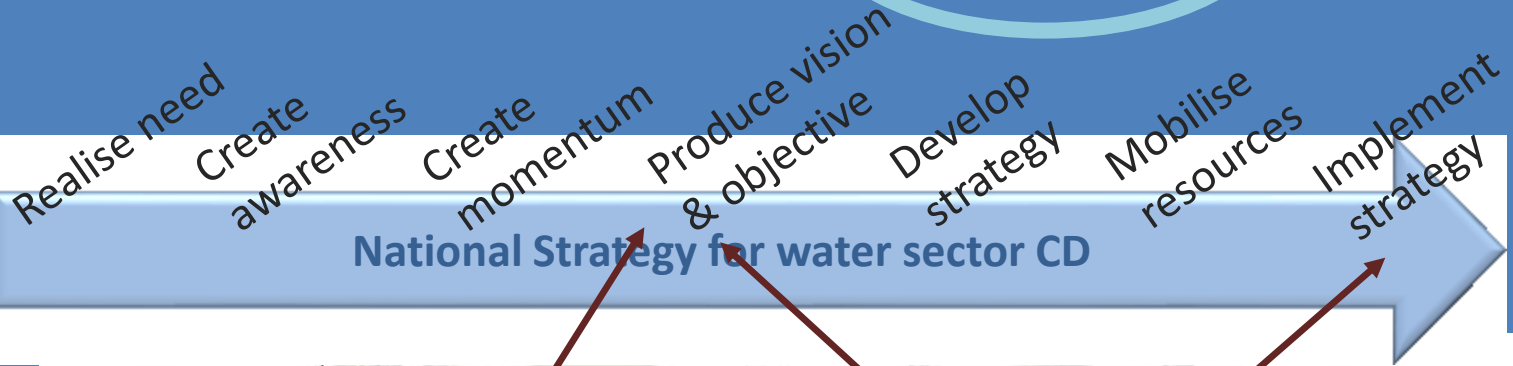

National CD Strategies - 2014

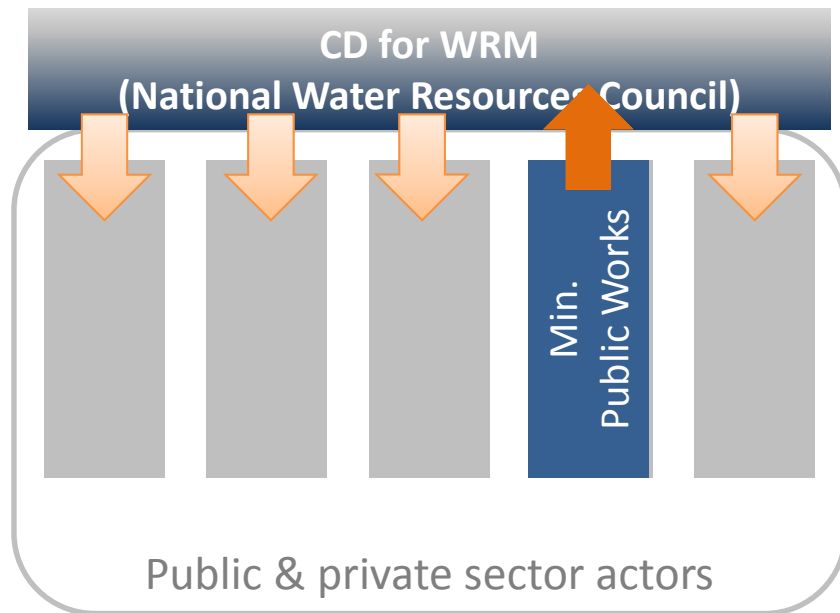

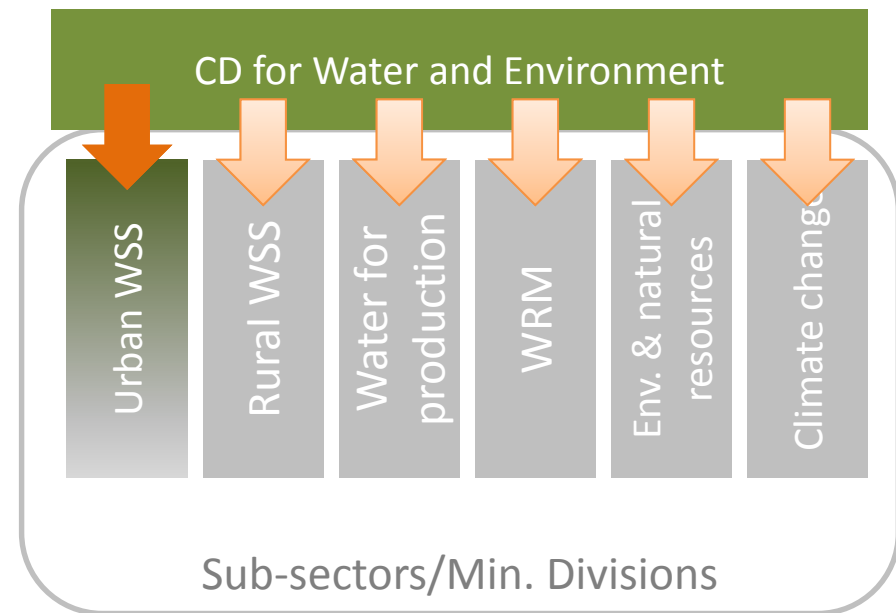

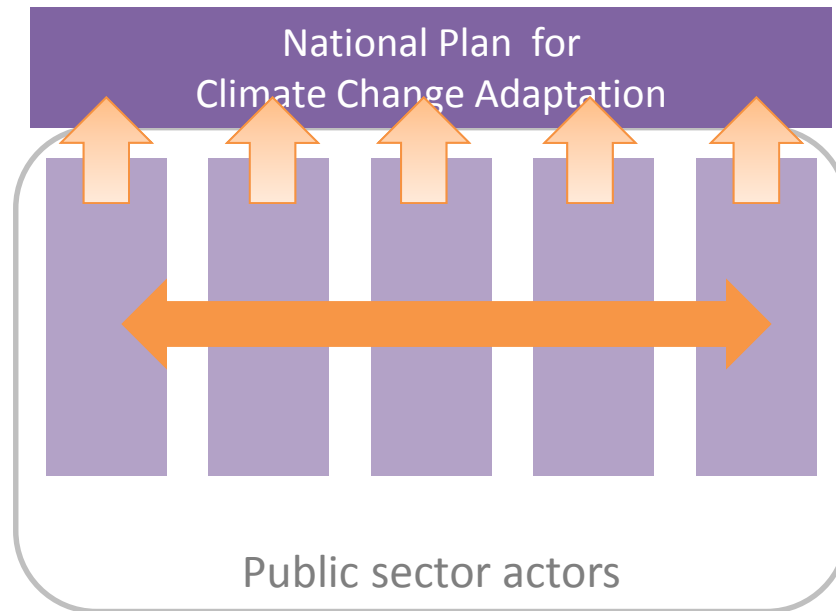
